▶ We did - action taken or planned to tackle your priorities

1. Anti-social behaviour in the area of the Peoples Hall, Sedbergh

The current community priority for the Kirkby Lonsdale and Sedbergh area is anti-social behaviour in the Peoples Hall area of Sedbergh. Regular patrols will visit the area. Activity will involve a Street Safe Operation, Environmental Visual Audit and increase in local visibility in the area.

▶ Crime Information

There was a report of a suspicious vehicle parked near to Kirkby Lonsdale business park. The male occupant of the vehicle was checked out and it was all in order.

There was also a call regarding parking in the Queen's Square area, where a vehicle was parking outside of the marked white bay in front of the memorial. The vehicle has had a warning noticed placed on it about where it was parking and no further complaints have been received.

The parking problems outside QES and St Marys has also been brought to our attention and as a result the children from St Marys are designing posters to highlight road safety issues, which will then be displayed along with a message from the Police on any vehicles parked inappropriately from September. This will also be featured in both Schools' magazines to highlight the issues to parents.

Scrap metal thefts are becoming a priority issue throughout the area and we ask people to remain vigilant. There have been a number of scrap metal thefts in our area over the past month, please report anything suspicious on 0845 33 00 247.
